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DREAMER TRUST, founded by Mithu Chowdhury in Kolkata, India, began its journey on October 30, 2020, during the COVID-19 pandemic.It was officially registered as a trust under the Indian Trust Act on March 20, 2021. The organization is dedicated to addressing critical social issues aligned with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), specifically SDG-2: Zero Hunger and SDG-4: Quality Education.

According to the 2023 Global Hunger Index (GHI), India has a score of 28.7, with an under nourishment rate of 16.6%,reflecting significant food insecurity, while literacy rate is only 77.7%. Dreamer Trust, a non-profit organization, addresses these challenges by focusing on hunger, education, and disaster management through crowdfunding and donations. The organization follows both an enabling and delivering model, empowering communities while directly implementing solutions. In addition to its regular programs, Dreamer Trust frequently conducts campaigns aimed at uplifting marginalized and underprivileged sections of society.

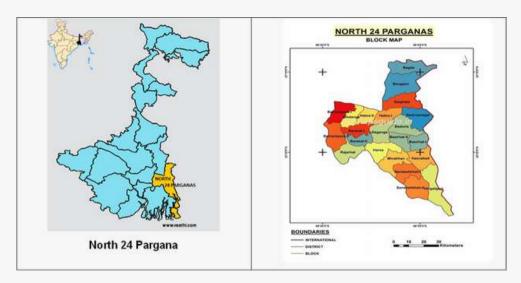

"ONE RUPEE THALI"

The trust initially focused on providing essential cooking item such as vegetables, cereals, and pulses to individuals and families who struggle to afford even a single meal, including those living under bridges and on footpaths. Over time, this initiative evolved, and in 2021-2022, the trust expanded its efforts by launching a "Food Basket" distribution program. This program targeted slum dwellers across various areas of the North 24 Parganas region, aiming to support those in need with consistent access to food and nutrition. Through this initiative, this organisation addresses the acute needs of the socioeconomically disadvantaged, ensuring that food resources are distributed efficiently to the needy community to mitigate the impacts of systemic poverty.

Project Description:

The concept behind "One Rupee Thali" project is every individual has the potential to contribute meaningfully, so no one should view themselves as a beggar. Our motto is not to seek gratitude, but to extend a hand in reducing inequality in society. Every day Dreamer Trust is providing One rupee thali in front of Barasat Govt. Medical college and Hospital. Average 200 - 250 individual collect food in everyday basis and there are many repetitions of similar individuals because of providing good and healthy qualities meal. Dreamer Trust always prioritizes providing a clean environment and nutritious food items which has led to significant increase in the number of people they serve.

In West Bengal education rate is 76.26%, where male literacy stands at 81.69% while female literacy is at 70.54%. RTE act speaks about providing free education up to 8th standard but may reports says that, there is a huge deficiency in accessing quality education. Drop out rate in secondary and higher secondary is also quite high and many students are promoted to the next class without proper assessment, which actually create hinderance in their future higher studies. With the motto of social upliftment, Dreamer Trust has been taken an initiative of Implementing "MUKTA SHIKSHA PATHSHALA" (A Free Coaching School)

Project Description:

Dreamer Trust launched the Mukta Pathashala programme offering coaching from 1st standard to 8th standard children from 2022 onwards. Over 30 students take part of this initiatives which managed by experience teachers. This education centre is located in the rural area of Bamangachi region in North 24 parganas dist., West Bengal.

In Initial phase Mukta Siksha Pathashala program is providing support on four segments. Here's how it is structured:

- 1. Subject Oriented Primary education
- 2. Organising Cultural Programme
- 3. Organising Sports activities
- 4. Drawing classes





Subject Oriented Primary Education

The Subject-Oriented primary education coaching under the Mukta Siksha Pathashala initiative focuses on delivering quality education to inspire students and drive a passion for learning. It aims to prepare them for higher education through proper assessment and guidance, ensuring they are ready for advancement of higher studies. This program seeks to shape qualified, educated individuals, paving the way for their future professional careers. Nutritional food is occasionally distributed to students, helping children to maintain both mental and physical well-being.

- 1. One teacher is dedicated to core subjects, ensuring students achieve academic success
- 2. Another One teacher is appointed for conducting weekly drawing classes.
- 3. Initiative of launching computer class, cognitive behaviour and counselling therapy session, spoken English classes is in nearer future loop.



09 Cultural Activities

The "Dreamer Trust" organizes various cultural events during occasions such as Holi, Diwali, Independence Day, Eid, Durga Puja, and New Year, specifically for underprivileged and neglected children. These events are designed to help children understand the value of regional cultures while encouraging them to express themselves through various activities.

The Trust offers a range of activities, including games, dance, singing, drawing, and reciting competitions.
